The verbs "like and dislike" can be followed by a noun.







For example:

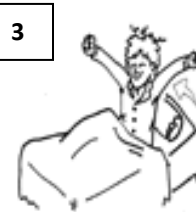
